

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

Monitoring Requirements Not Met for GA1450003 Waverly Hall

Our water system recently violated drinking water standards. Although this is not an emergency, as our customers you have the Right to Know.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether are not our drinking water meets health standards.

What happened?

During the 1/1/21 – 12/31/23 compliance period The Waverly Hall Staff sampled Lead and Copper at ten residential sites and submitted samples to the EPD lab as obligated, unfortunately some of the samples were received outside of regulatory hold times and not tested. Therefore we cannot be sure of your quality of water Lead and Copper during the last compliance period.

What should I do?

There is nothing to do at this time. These violations do not pose a threat to the quality of water supplied. Residents should not be alarmed or seek alternative water supplies. GA1450003 Waverly Hall is taking corrective actions to ensure that adequate monitoring and reporting will be maintained.

What happened? What is being done?

The lead and copper rule protects public health by minimizing lead and copper levels in drinking water, primarily by reducing corrosivity. Lead and Copper enters drinking water mainly from corrosion of lead and copper containing plumbing material.

GA1450003 Waverly Hall will resample lead and copper during the current regulatory period so that the samples are analyzed and results are properly recorded.
